



Walk for the Wild Challenge

To complete the Walk for the Wild Challenge (5K / 3.1 miles), you will need to walk the **Interpretive Loop** (1.1 miles), **Levee Loop** (1 mile down and back) and **Floodplain Loop** (1 mile down and back).



#1 WFTW Trail Start -follow the orange cones to complete the 5K WFTW

- Walk the levee trail to the spillway (0.5 miles)
- #7 Levee Loop to Spillway (1.0 mile down and back)
 - The spillway maintains the level of the lake.
 - You may return to pier or to complete the challenge continue to turnaround (0.5 miles)

#8 Floodplain Loop (1.0 mile down and back)

- You will leave the levee and walk a wide, level trail through the floodplain forest.
- Turnaround at the orange tape barrier.
- Take a "selfie" at the WFTW turnaround for the WFTW Challenge

WFTW Challenge Board – add your name and comments to the board when you...

- take a "selfies" at the Scat Trail, Big Tree and WFTW turnaround
- Observe any wildlife or unusual plant
- Complete 5K WFTW

Trinity River National Wildlife Refuge

The Trinity River National Wildlife Refuge is the summer home of one of the most elegant and beautiful hawks in America, the **Swallow-Tailed Kite**. Also, the TRNWR is the year-round home of the largest-known Texas colony of the **amazing Rafinesque's Big-Eared Bat.**





The Trinity River NWR is used during **migration or nesting by nearly 50 percent of the neotropical migratory bird species** in North America with **275 species identified on the refuge and over 200 species nesting on the refuge**. It is a biodiversity hotspot with more than 650 vertebrate, 1700 insect, and 650 plant species documented on the refuge.



Trinity River National Wildlife Refuge was established **to protect a remnant of the bottomland hardwood forest ecosystem along the Trinity River**. In addition to its important conservation mission, the refuge offers recreational activitieshiking, hunting, fishing, paddling, wildlife watching, photography, and environmental education.
